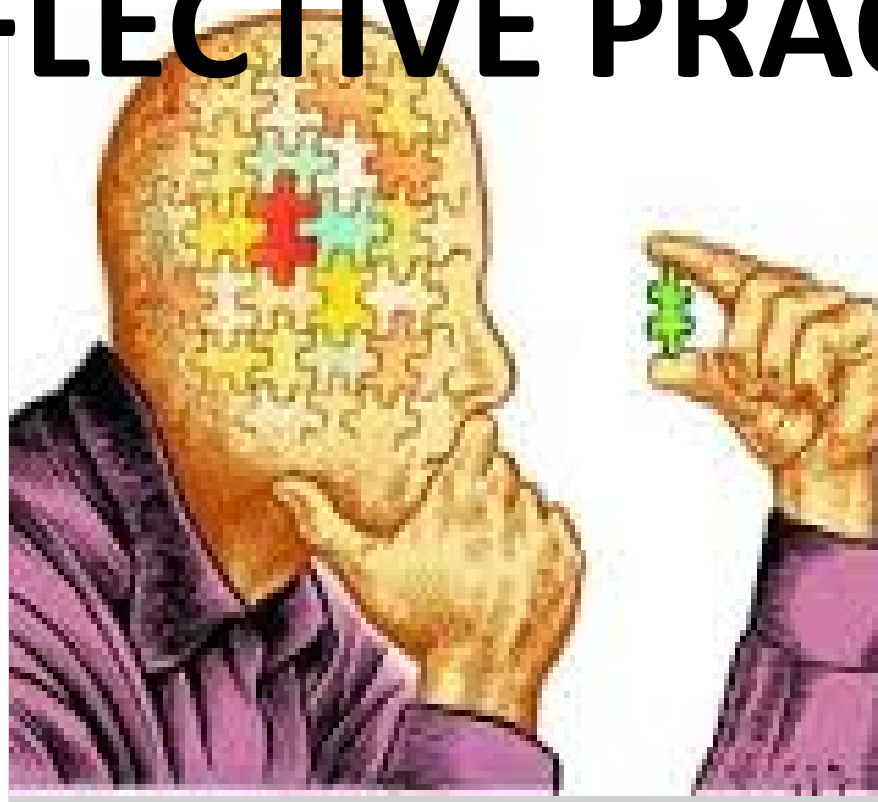

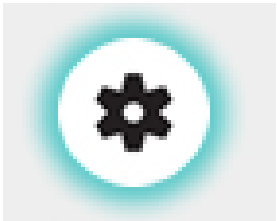

PROBLEM SOLVING DEFINITIONS

PROBLEM SOLVING - IN CONTEXT

Select two problems encountered in your group.

Write a brief reflection and add evidence.

Report – tried to contact team members using the Group Discussion Forum, three times this week and no-one responded

- Evidence is the posts made

Relate – this is going to cause us to fall behind in our work. It is also frustrating me that my group is not responding – may need to try another form of communication and what I am saying in the communication

Reflect – next time I start group work we need to exchange mobile numbers early and when I send out communication, I need to give people a date and time as to when I expect a reply. I have solved the problem by coming up with a new solution



WHAT IS REFLECTIVE PRACTICE?

‘We do not learn from experience...
we learn from reflecting on experience.’

John Dewey

To **step back** and **think** about what you are doing

- What is happening?
- Why is it happening?
- Is it good or bad? And what am I basing the judgement on?

To **learn** and **improve**

- What could be done different / better? How?
- What is the impact of the change?

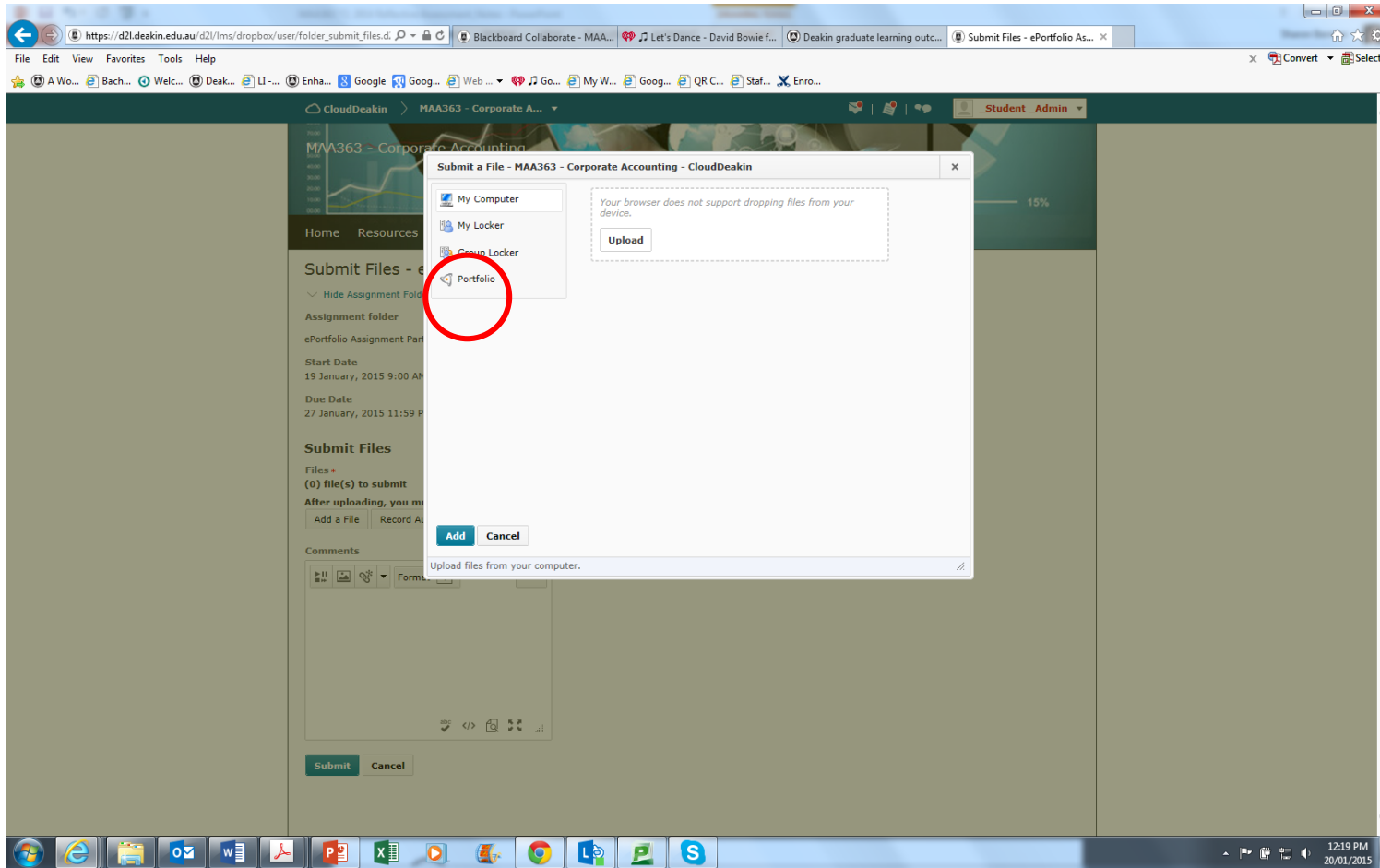

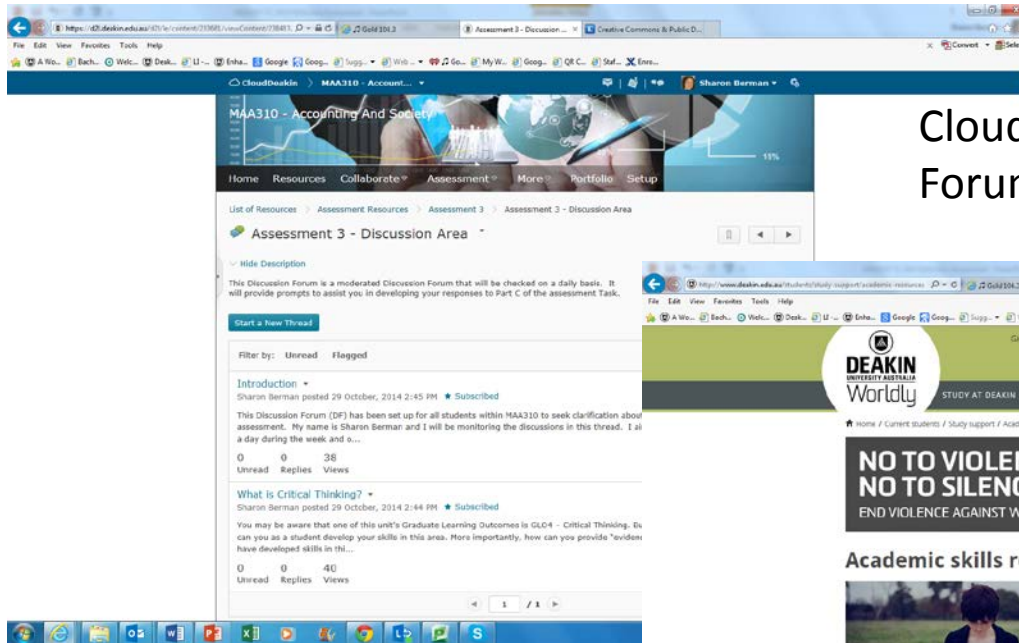

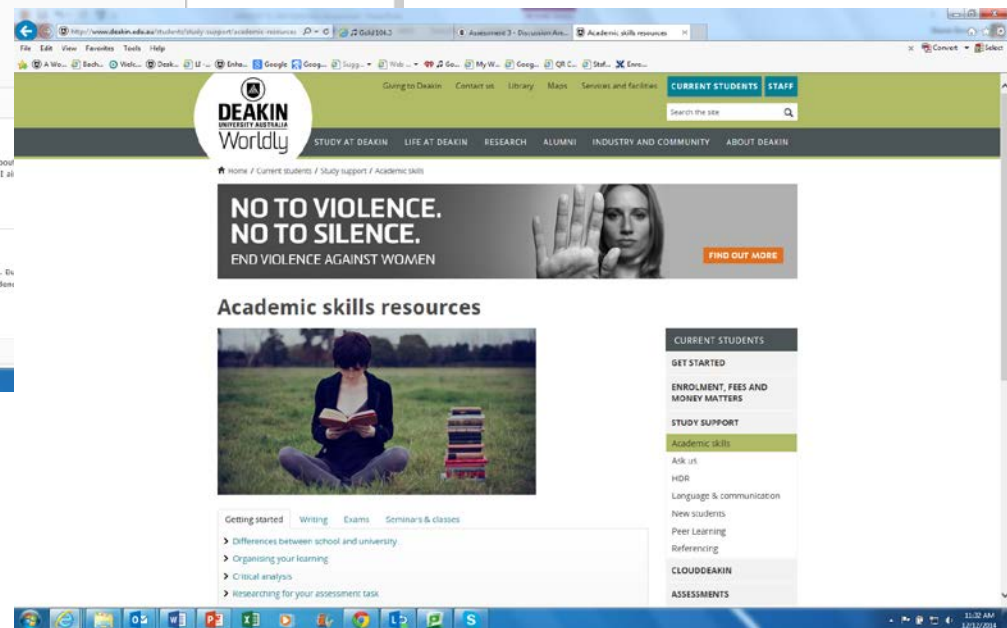
